Awards and Scholarships Presented at Annual Luncheon

With the help of a very generous contribution received in 2008, the Concrete Industry Foundation was able to present a record number of scholarships at the 2009 CIF awards luncheon. A total of 16 students received financial assistance for their education, a union apprentice program received a grant, and two industry leaders were recognized for their contributions to future generations of the industry. While this many scholarship awards may not be possible each year, the CIF truly appreciates the opportunity to expand its outreach.

The scholarships, in the amount of \$2,000 each, were awarded to students who are

studying in fields related to the concrete built environment.

At the luncheon, held at the New York Athletic Club, the Foundation presented its 2009 Humanitarian Fellow medal to Francis J. Lombardi, chief engineer of the Port Authority of New York & New Jersey.
